NALC Stamp Out Hunger Food Drive

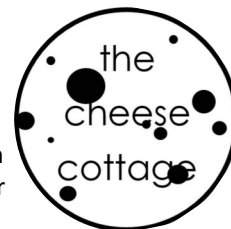

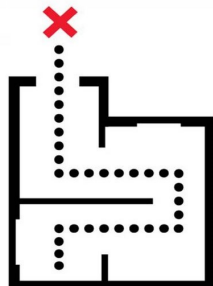
