## USW Celebrates Pride Month and Recommits to Fighting for LGBTQ+ Community

(Pittsburgh. June 3, 2019) - United Steelworkers (USW) International President Leo W. Gerard, along with the union's recently formed LGBTQ+ Advisory Council, released the following statement today, in honor of Pride Month: "Our union was founded on the guiding principle that all workers should be treated with dignity and respect. In 1942, our founders declared that we would unite in one organization, regardless of creed, color or nationality, all working men and women eligible for membership. This month, as the world observes the 50th anniversary of the Stonewall riots with annual Pride celebrations all across the globe, we recommit to that principle and honor all of our proud members of the LGBTQ+ (Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, and Queer) community.

"For the past two and a half years, our country's administration has launched relentless attacks on LGBTQ+ Americans, from banning transgender soldiers from serving in the military, to aiming to give doctors the right to deny health care to patients because of who they love. These actions do not represent the American spirit or the principles that lie at the core of the labor movement, including our union.

"Labor leaders and activists must continue fighting both in Washington and at the bargaining table to empower LGBTQ+ workers by pushing legislation such as the Equality Act and improving union contracts by adding non-discrimination language that includes sexual orientation and gender identity protections.

"The USW calls on its activists to celebrate Pride across the United States and Canada this month by recommitting to this fight, and to continue ensuring LGBTQ+ voices and concerns are addressed in the halls of Congress and within our collective bargaining agreements."

The USW represents 850,000 men and women employed in manufacturing, metals, mining, pulp and paper, rubber, chemicals, glass, auto supply and the energy-producing industries, along with a growing number of workers in public sector and service occupations.

### Community Service Spotlight: Crittenton Youth Services



The mission of Crittenton Youth Services is to provide educational services that promote the

physical, emotional, and social health of all youth. The visionis to educate as many teens so that attitudes and beliefs about risky behaviors will change producing positive behaviors that will create a brighter future for youths of today.

#### **Crittenton Programs:**

The Ambassadors - Seniors who are selected from the Mobile County Public School System, private, and parochial schools. Chosen based on their desire to help younger peers and their strong moral character, they are trained to teach bullying skills in grades three through eight.

Olweus Bullying Prevention - This program is a comprehensive, school-wide program with objectives to increase the number of students who report bullying to adults; decrease the number of bullying incidents; promote better peer and adult/child relationships; train the schools' staff to be proactive and responsive to bullying; incorporate parents and the community as major components of the program. Mobile County elementary and middle schools can apply to be an Olweus school.

**PATHS** - The primary goal of the curriculum is to provide activities in a small group setting that promotes independence skills, self-control, an understanding of emotions, better relationships with adults and peers, and problem-solving. All of these skills promote better behaviors and academic achievement in the classroom.

**Relationship Smarts** - This curriculum teaches healthy versus unhealthy relationships and consequences that come from being involved in an unhealthy relationship. It also has a parent connect component to help students build a healthy line of communication with their parents/caregivers.

Community Outreach - Community Outreach provides speaking engagement upon request to schools, clubs, churches and other community organizations. The Executive Director appears on local television and radio stations throughout Mobile to address various teen issues.
